

ACT 46 PLANNING SURVEY – RESULTS As of 3/3/17
PLYMOUTH SCHOOL DISTRICT

32% (or 143) of all registered voters survey returns: not all completed at 100%: 484 surveys mailed out; approx. 37 mail returned; Total = 447 assumed received by registered voters

I understand that the school board and its appointed members of the WCSU Act 46 Study Committee are proposing to put Option #1 before the voters of the Town of Plymouth. There are three approaches for consideration:

1. Plymouth would become a member of a Unified Union District or a Modified Unified Union School District together with other towns in the Windsor Central Supervisory Union. School choice would be phased out by FY2019. Plymouth would become part of a new multi-town school district with proportional representation on the new school board. Most Plymouth students would attend schools operated within the new district. This proposal would come with homestead tax incentives. Students currently enrolled in a Supervisory Union, Supervisory District or a private school will be allowed to remain in their current school setting and required to transition at the next school entry (i.e. from Elementary to Middle School or Middle to High School). Beginning with the 2018-19 academic year all Plymouth newly enrolled students must enroll in the new Windsor Central Modified Unified Union District or Unified Union District. **#1 = 72; #2 = 35; #3 = 27**
2. Plymouth would become a member of a Unified Union School District together with other towns in the Two Rivers Supervisory Union. Plymouth would be allowed proportional representation on the new school board. Most Plymouth students would attend schools operated within the new district. This proposal would come with homestead tax incentives. Students currently enrolled in a Supervisory Union, Supervisory District or a private school will be allowed to remain in their current school setting and required to transition at the next school entry (i.e. from Elementary to Middle School or Middle to High School). Beginning with the 2018-19 academic year all Plymouth newly enrolled students must enroll in Two Rivers Supervisory Union. **#1 = 9; #2 = 74; #3 = 47**
3. The Plymouth School District would not recommend any kind of unification, and instead propose to the State Board to remain an independent district with school choice for all students. Under Act 46, Plymouth can retain school choice if it so chooses. Plymouth will be combined into a different school district with other “choice towns” if the State Board of Education so chooses and if Plymouth doesn’t unify with others on its own. **#1 = 57; #2 = 21; #3 = 56**
